Foster Care - Amity sponsors 25 children for foster care at Ganzhou Social Welfare Institute and met with all of them on this visit. A new administrator at Ganzhou SWI, Mr. Jiang, accompanied Amity's team on the visits with the foster families. Secretary Jiang is familiar with the Institute and its happenings, and it was a pleasure to have him take time to familiarize himself with all of the foster families. He accompanied the Amity team on interviews, and spent time playing with the children and talking with the foster parents. The children are all growing up well and are situated in wonderful families, contributing to their overall happiness and health.

<u>Tuition</u> - There are 21 children Amity sponsors for education expenses. Most of these children are in primary school. There is one high school graduate who is attending a three year program in nursing. One of the younger children in primary school has shown a talent for Chinese Opera and has enrolled in extra classes which provide a more in depth experience in traditional Chinese dance and singing.



ZY is 7 years old. She has been getting along well with her classmates and is involved in school activities. Her foster mother takes her to school and picks her up in the afternoon. On the way home, ZY eagerly tells her foster mother everything that happened in school. Once she is finished with homework, she likes to be with her foster mother and help around the house.

HC is 13 years old and enjoys a close relationship with her foster family. She is doing well in school, earns good grades and has good study habits. She helps her foster family with chores at home. Her foster father is very helpful to her with her studies and remembers to bring HC her favourite snacks after school!





ZM is 6 years old and able to write many characters which are very tidy and neat. He studies well, has a good memory and is able to count from 1 to 100 without help. ZM is independent in dressing and feeding himself. He has a healthy appetite although he has definite preferences for certain foods.
