Numbers of Children

The Institute is responsible for a total of about 120 children, many with disabilities including congenital heart disease, cerebral palsy, and other mental disabilities. About 30 children are in foster care supported by the orphanage itself and 3 receive Altrusa scholarships to attend schools outside the SWI.

Granny Liu Aizhen is responsible for the rehabilitation and cognitive learning of the children. She started working at Jiujiang in 2012 and frequently collaborates with more experienced grannies in order to provide the best care possible. In the photo at left, she is doing rehabilitation exercises with DD to help him walk better. Granny Liu also helps him with speaking and pronunciation so that he may learn to express his ideas more clearly.

Granny Zhong Yanqiu

Zhong Yanqiu is an experienced Granny who has been working at the SWI for seven years. She uses physical therapy to help disabled children improve their coordination and increase strength. Recently, the SWI received a new apparatus to aid in rehabilitation. Granny shows the children the various activities that can be done with the machine and encourages them to try it for themselves. Doing these fun exercises with the machine is extremely helpful to children who have cerebral palsy and brain development delays.



Update Received in January 2013



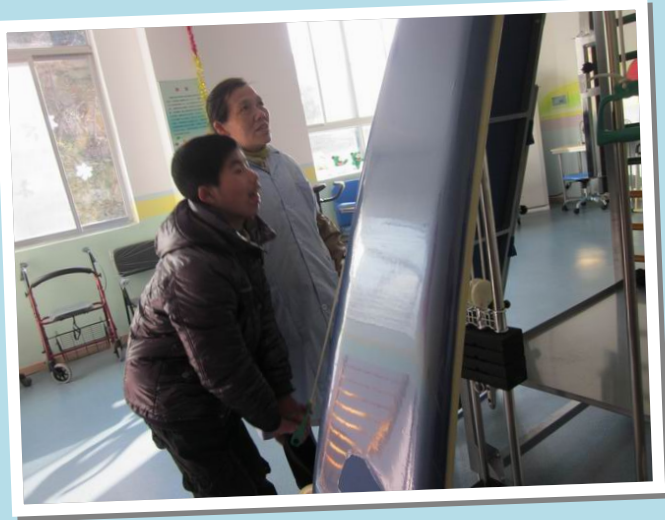
