Ms. Gao is the new director at Shangrao SWI and Ms. Mao is in charge of children's services. Currently, there are 60 children, most of whom are disabled, under their care. Amity/Altrusa sponsors 30 children in foster care, while 7 live at the orphanage. The foster care expenses for 12 children are handled by the SWI. One premature baby is in the hospital in Shangrao and ten children are receiving medical treatment; some in Beijing or Heifei for heart disease or cleft lip, some are in rehab or a special school for mild autism or deafness, and some are in the "Home of Hope" in Tianjin.

In 2012, Shangrao SWI processed 9 international adoptions, mostly to the US, and all of them were special needs. They had 3 adoptive families come back to visit during the year and 7 visited the year before.

Foster Care

Shangrao takes a teamwork approach to overseeing foster care. Ms. Mao is in charge, however she gets help from Ms. Wang, who is in charge of adoption affairs, and Ms. Huang, the doctor. They are very conscientious about weighing the babies as well as the older children. They are more cautious and take weights more often when a baby is premature or after a child has had surgery. All records are kept electronically in their computer.

They are eager to resume the nutrition support that we provided in the past, especially since one child was rejected for adoption due to underdevelopment. The children now receive supplements and they want them to have more protein in their diet.


