Numbers of Children

Now there are over 70 children at Wanzai SWI, 6 of whom are fostered by Altrusa/Amity. 11 of these children are living inside the SWI, while 60 are fostered outside at the expense of SWI. These children live either downtown or in the countryside, the farthest being about one hour's drive away. At present there are three children between the ages of 15 and 20 and some 70 children under the age of 10. 6 children are receiving rehabilitation training at the Nanchang Social Welfare Institute.

Adoptions!!

In 2012, 24 children were adopted abroad and 6 were adopted by Chinese families. In 2013, 4 children were adopted by foreigners and 3 were adopted by Chinese families.

Four new rehabilitation bases have been set up by the Civil **Affairs** Department. The disabled children at the Wanzai Social Welfare Institute used to be sent to Nanchana for rehabilitation training. Now, since there is a rehabilitation base in the Yuanzhou District of Yichun City, those children who need rehabilitation training will be sent there.

children living in the Welfare Institute. most whom are disabled. They are cared for by childcare workers. Other staff members often accompany these children, teasing and playing with them. The children adore this. Every time the child-care workers come near. the children sweetly call them "Mom".

Six foster families were visited. An individual report and photo of each child will be sent to their sponsor, but photos of a few of them are included below.



WJS is a 7-year-old boy with Hydrocephalus. He is shy in front of strangers, but loves to spend time with his classmates, especially during school recesses. He is a generous boy and likes to share his food and toys with friends. WJS can communicate with others well and takes an active part in his school activities.

WLX is a 3-year-old airl with Cerebral Palsy. She can understands many words and respond accordingly. WLX is learning to speak and can say "Aunt", "Grandma", and "Mom". She can express herself well with body language. For example, if she wants to eat something, she can point to it. WLX loves music and playing outside.

WLL is a 4-year-old girl with Cerebral Palsy. She loves kindergarten and gets on well with friends there. Although she can't speak, she can use her body language to express herself. If someone asks her to fetch a cup, she understands and can get it correctly. WLL has good appetite and sleeps well.
